Contentment leads to empowerment *Philippians 4:12-13; Ephesians 2:10*

Considerations for the week

Agur humbly recognized his own lack of wisdom. Review <u>Proverbs 30:1-4</u> and comment upon the bases of his humility.

Our society highly values individuality and one's own opinion. How can we live humbly in a world that often promotes self-aggrandizement?

Recall the analogies Agur used to describe societal issues – reality check (v. 15-16) amazing enigmas (v. 18-19) human mistakes (v. 21-23) small wonders (v. 24-28) downfall of kings (v. 29-30)

Describe how these provide a viewpoint to help us understand our society and how they can be used to address contemporary societal challenges.

Agur describes a generation "whose teeth are swords and whose jaws are set with knives to devour the poor from the earth and the needy from among mankind." (v. 14). Discuss steps we can we take to lessen the probability that we are such a generation.

Agur chose not to profane the name of the Lord. How do we profane the name of the Lord in respect to the material things in our lives?

Please use these considerations for personal reflection, small group discussions, and with friends and family.
